Pre-Shoot Prep Guide

We recommend treating the day of your photo shoot like it's first showing, because in most cases it will be. The photos captured on the photo shoot day will be what people see to determine whether your home makes "the cut". While it seems like another task in a long list in selling your home, prepping the house will go a long way. It'll be good practice for all the showings that'll be coming your way!

Declutter your home as much as possible. Less really is more in this case. We don't want the space to seem sterile, but too much "stuff" on shelves, tables, walls, etc. can distract from other features of your home. And since you'll have to pack eventually go ahead and box those items up and store it in a closet, basement, or attic space. Less to do on moving day!	 Staging your table with a simple table setting goes a long way. A centerpiece of fresh flowers, produce, or decor can add a nice touch. Bedrooms Make the bed. Fluff your pillows. Pull down and straighten any bedskirts.
 A general cleaning is in order too. Vacuum carpets. Mop floors. Wipe down solid surfaces. The camera can be forgiving, so this doesn't need to be a deep clean, but a general clean looks great in camera. Make sure you've replaced any burnt out light bulbs throughout the house. 	 Consider NOT storing items under your bed. Things underneath the bed can often be seen. Remove as many charging cords and power strips from the bedside tables as possible. Hide clothes hampers. Make sure all the drawers in furniture can shut all the way. Same for closet doors.
